

The Marks of a Faithful Minister II Timothy 4:1-5 October 19, 2014

Introduction:

Every minister must always remember that he did not choose the ministry; God used the ministry to call him.

I Corinthians 9:16 For though I preach the gospel, I have nothing to glory of: for necessity is laid upon me; yea, woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel.

II Corinthians 4:5 For we do not preach ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord, and ourselves your bondservants for Jesus' sake.

I. The Seriousness of the Charge

II Timothy 4:1a I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ...

John Calvin:

"He makes special mention of the judgment of Christ because He will require of us, who are his representatives, a stricter account of our failures in His ministry."

- A. We are to preach with confidence. Verse 2a Preach the Word...
- B. We are to preach constantly.Verse 2b be ready in season and out of season...

It is not our job to make the message <u>acceptable</u>... it is our job to make the message <u>available</u>.

C. We are to preach with conviction. Verse 2c reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine.

Joel Osteen

- **II.** The Sadness of the Times
 - A. Sound doctrine is expelled. II Timothy 4:3-4 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine...
 - **B.** Selfish desires are exalted.

Verse 3b but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears.

John MacArthur:

"Bad doctrine is tolerable, a long sermon most certainly is not. The timing of the benediction is of far more concern to the average churchgoer than the content of the sermon. Sunday dinner and the feeding of our mouth take precedence over Sunday School and the nourishment of our souls. Longwindedness has become a greater sin than heresy."

C. Self-Consumption is Expected.

II Timothy 4:4 And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.

Takeaway:

When a man will not believe in God and the Bible, he will believe in anything.

II Thessalonians 2:10-11 And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie.

II Timothy 4:5c do the work of an evangelist...

John Wesley:

"You may be elegant, you may be winsome, you may be a good financier, yes, you may be in great demand, but if you do not win souls, you are a failure."

D. Be willing to be accountable.

II Timothy 4:5d make full proof of thy ministry.
